IDAHO TRAPSHOOTING HALL OF FAME

The Idaho Trapshooting Hall of Fame, formed in 1988, is a nonprofit organization with the following mission "To record and memorialize significant people, places and events in the history of trapshooting in the state of Idaho and to promote trapshooting and educate the public as to the values of the sport of and to preserve the history, records, artifacts and other memorabilia as well as to promote and provide inspiration to all trap shooters. Over the past 34 years 47 people have been inducted into the Idaho Hall of Fame, becoming part of the Idaho trapshooting legacy. The Idaho Trapshooting Hall of Fame offers college scholarships to high school seniors who have actively participated in the sport of trapshooting. Application materials are available through any board member. Nominations for the Hall of Fame can be made for future induction consideration. Nominations are due by May 1st for the following year.

The Idaho Trapshooting Hall of Fame raises funds to achieve the mission through fundraising, donations, Lewis Purses at Idaho trapshoots where a portion of the option fee is returned to the Hall of Fame. Funds are used for recognition events and scholarships.

You can send your donations to the Idaho Trapshooting Hall of Fame. You can also obtain scholarship and nomination forms from Sue, or any member of the Idaho Trapshooting Hall of Fame Board of Directors.





TARGET SETTING – Target setting will be under the direction of the hosting gun club with supervision by the Idaho PITA. No targets will be changed without permission from a hosting gun club representative or Idaho PITA Representative to make the change.

REFUNDS - No entry fees, purses, or options will be refunded after the event has started. Also, no purse or options will be accepted after the first score sheet is posted. All refunds will be mailed with the payoffs.

CONDUCT - The Idaho PITA and the hosting gun club reserves the right to refuse entry or withdraw any contestant who in any way interferes with the safety, harmony, and enjoyment of this shoot.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE - Will be the Idaho PITA board members.

PENALTY YARDAGE AND CLASSIFICATION - All shooters who have shot less than 500 registered handicap targets since they have started shooting will shoot at 24 yards for the State Shoot only*. All shooters who have shot less than 500 registered 16 yard targets will shoot singles in A class for the State Shoot only. All shooters who have shot less than 200 registered doubles targets will shoot in B class for the State Shoot only.

ATA targets will count toward target requirements.

SPECIAL CATEGORIES:

A Sub-junior is a person who has not attained their 15th birthday. For events where no Sub-junior trophy is offered, Sub-juniors shall be eligible to compete for the Junior trophy.

A Junior is a person who has attained their 15th birthday but has not attained their 18th birthday.

A Veteran is a person who has attained their 65th birthday but has not attained their 70th birthday.

A Senior Veteran is a person who has attained their 70th birthday but has not attained their 75th birthday. For events where no Senior Veteran trophy is offered, Senior Veterans shall be eligible to compete for the Veteran trophy.

An Elder is a person who has attained their 75th birthday. For events where no Elder trophy is offered, Elders shall be eligible to compete for the oldest category trophy available.

A Rookie is any shooter who has shot less than one calendar year from the time they shot their first registered targets.

*Juniors, Sub-Juniors and Ladies may shoot at 22 yards.

Failure to Fire rule. - You are allowed two failures to fire per sub-event in the 16 yard, handicap, and doubles events. It is not counted as a failure to fire if a "no target" is thrown. Check your rule book for details.

Handicap Rule. All shooters will shoot their longest handicap yardage, ATA or PITA.

BROKEN TARGET RULE - When a broken target is thrown, regardless of whether the shooter shoots at the target or not, it is declared "NO TARGET".

The State Board of Directors and the hosting gun club reserve the right to change or modify any part of the program, if necessary.

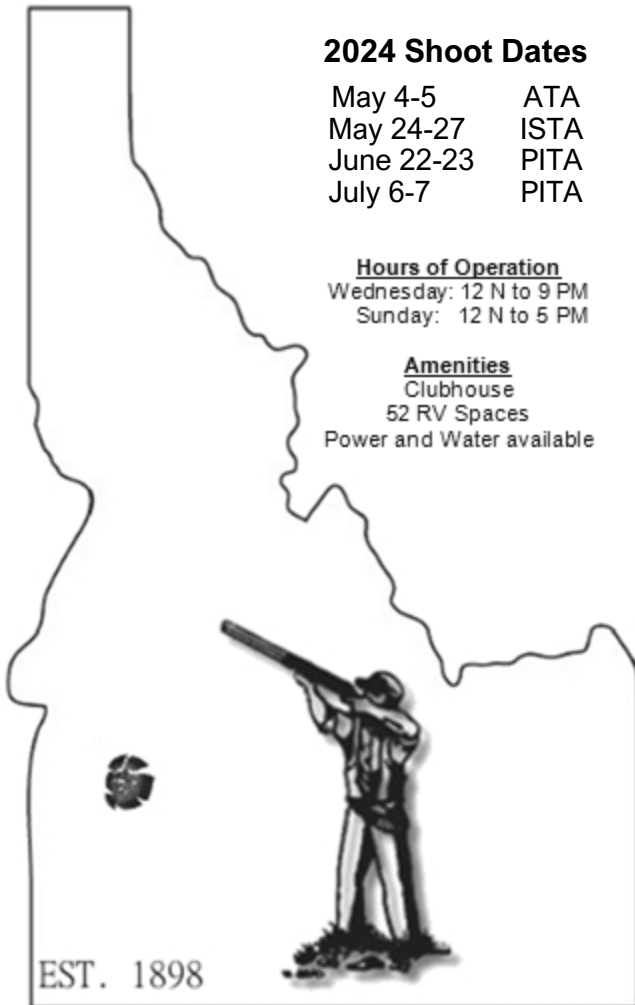

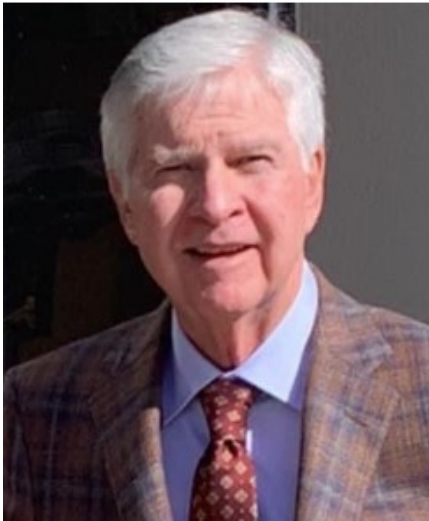

He had the attention of all shooters in 2019 when he took down more than his share of the perpetual posts in Southern Idaho. Shooters all around the state would gather to watch Evan shoot his doubles events. Like Evan, his doubles events were definitely something to behold. He would smoke the first bird before it even cleared the house and would have that second one breaking so fast that some people thought only one bird left the house.

Evan got his first job as a junior in high school. He did what many of us do and secured employment. He headed to the trusty golden arches of McDonalds. In January of 2020, Evan met Torry, his true love. Over the past three years, these two had SO many adventures and were planning a bright future together.

In May of 2021, Evan graduated from Rocky Mountain High School.

On April 1, (yes....April Fools, in true Evan fashion) 2022, Evans spread his wings and moved out on his own. He and several of his friends moved into a house together in Meridian.

On May 10, 2022, Evan gained employment at Builders First Source where his mother, Lisa, works. Over the past year and a half, he has worked in the lumber yard doing returns and load building. Evan gained so many great relationships with his Builders First Source family. He had goals of growing his career within the company.

Anyone that got the pleasure of spending any amount of time with Evan knew that he was just a real and genuine person. We never met anyone that didn't love him.

Rest easy in the arms of our Father God. We will see you when we get there sweet boy.

Colten Michael Harrsch was born on June 2, 2001, to his loving parents Terri and Michael. He was born and raised in Meridian, ID. He was the little brother to Alyssa and the big brother to Tarynn.

Colten was Terri and Mike's second child and he was trouble from the word go. He made his presence known right away as he was a colicky baby. After 4 months of that nonsense, he became the smiliest baby ever. He was born with that mischievous twinkle in his eye that never left.

Colten, aka Bubba, was your typical boy. He was our Curious George, always curious to see how things worked and loved being a helper to anyone who would have him. He loved his big sister Alyssa and got some of his silliness from her. When Tarynn was born, he informed his mom that she was HIS baby and adored her so much.

He joined T-ball at around 3 or 4 years old and fell in love with the sport of baseball that would continue throughout his life.

During his time in Elementary school, he was a member of the Cub Scouts, and joined his first Optimist Football team, a sport which he would play for 2 years. He was a good football player, not great, as he didn't want to hurt the other kids. However, if his temper was unleashed, then it was game on.

And speaking of that temper, whew! A lot of times it got the better of him. And when you add stubbornness to the mix you got yourself a handful! He came by those 2 traits honestly to be sure.

While in middle school, he joined the NWall Little League Minor Baseball League and became an amazing pitcher and player. He even pitched while having a broken finger!

Colten was a natural talent in every sport he tried. He went to a 6-week wrestling camp, just to see if he liked it. Colten was a phenomenal trapshooter. He had exceptional eyesight which definitely helped him bust those clays. In his first ever competition shoot, he won Class C Champion and got his first 25 patch. That set the bar to which he would surpass with every shoot.

One day in Twin Falls, he was having a bad shoot and was not having fun. His mom and dad told him to just go shoot some doubles for fun. Since he had

never shot doubles before and didn't know how, he asked Lahoma, a fellow trap-shooter, how to shoot them. She gave him the basics, and told him to watch the other shooters. He went out and shot an 89 the first day and a 93 the second day and ended up winning the State Junior Doubles Championship, all with his Remington 870 pump shotgun. He began in class A for doubles and there he remained. This is when his mom and dad decided he was pretty serious about this shooting thing and bought him his Browning Citori, Special Clays Edition shotgun for an early graduation gift to which he would name Shelby, after his favorite car at the time.

Four months of competition shooting took him to the Grand Pacific International Trapshooting competition in Spokane WA. He then found out he would be representing Idaho for Rookie of The Year. His mom and dad told him not to expect to win anything as there were seasoned shooters from 9 different states and British Columbia and he'd only been shooting for a few months. He would go on to win the Class C Singles Championship in his first ever shoot off, and also won The PITA Hall of Fame Handicap Event, with a 99, that had 269 shooters. It was in this event that he dropped his third bird and ran the rest which gave him his first 50 and 75 patches. To which he said when it was over "my hands were shaking like Tom Hanks in Saving Private Ryan". He would also end up winning the coveted P.I.T.A. Rookie of The Year in a nail-biting, heart-stopping shoot-off. Right after that event, he was in the last shoot off to win a Browning 725 Citori. His was the last shot of the Grand Pacific that took home the Browning to which he named Nizmo, his favorite car at the time. The following shooting year, on a rainy, cold, and windy day in March, he would get his first of 5 "100" patches. When he was in the zone, watching him shoot was a thing of beauty.

Throughout his 29 competition shoots, he would take home a trophy or cash prize from each one. He won numerous Rookie, Jr, Jr Gold, Class, High Over All and High All Around championship titles and multiple scholarships.

He was pretty excited when he won the Idaho State Doubles Championship, finally beating a lot of the other shooters he looked up to and wanted to be as good as. One of his favorite accomplishments was being on a 125 team, which means each shooter on the team all shot a perfect score of 25.

Bubba worked at Blaze Pizza twice, once during high school and again for a while after he broke his hand. He was known for being a hard worker, reliable, and being willing go the extra mile. He made a lot of friends and was the best pizza smith around.

When the family took their dream vacation to the Island of Kauai in 2018, the kids took surfing lessons and of course, Colten was up and surfing in 15 minutes! He was a natural at that too.

Colten took welding classes in high school and graduated in May of 2019. He received his welding certificate from CWI in the winter of 2020. He wasn't just a natural in sports, he was a darn good welder. His teacher was so impressed by his work that he kept some of his welds to show other students. He worked for Western Trailer as a welder until he broke his hand at the end of summer in 2021. Colten then started his career with Aero Specialties in 2021, welding and working the saw. He and Tarynn worked there together this past year and had a great time and made so many wonderful memories.

On Tuesday, September 26, 2023, the world lost the most beautiful boy, Colten Michael Harrsch. He had a heart of gold and was kind and thoughtful of others. Every winter he would shovel snow off of our neighbors' driveways. His kindness was evident in the fact that he had chosen to be an organ donor. He was a prankster who loved puns and dad jokes and thrifting for fast food work shirts. Colten was a sensitive soul and had a soft heart, which not many people knew since he hid it with all his shenanigans. When you think of him, you remember how funny he was, always trying to make you laugh. Oh, and the accents! He was a natural at cracking one liners with whatever goofy accent and facial expressions fit it at the time, whether it was his version of a Scottish accent or if he was a chap from England. The sarcasm was strong with that one! Colten gave the best rib-cracking hugs. He had a great poker face too, so good that sometimes when he'd make a sarcastic comment, his mom would look at him and say "are you being serious right now? Are you joking?" and the only way you could tell if he was or not was to see that mischievous twinkle in his eyes. Bubba loved taking pictures, especially of the moon and sunsets and whatever else caught his eye. He was a romantic and sentimental soul. He loved all kinds of music and even had subwoofers installed in his car to amplify the bass he loved so much. Colten also loved all types of cars and enjoyed playing video games with his sisters and friends. He loved ice cream so much he probably singlehandedly kept DQ in business as well as the dill pickle sunflower seed company. And oh, how that boy loved rollercoasters!

Colten was our sun, moon, and stars... our everything. We loved him his whole young life and will miss him every second of every day of the rest of ours. We love you to infinity and beyond sweet, boy, it's not goodbye, it's until we see you again. We love you, Bubba.

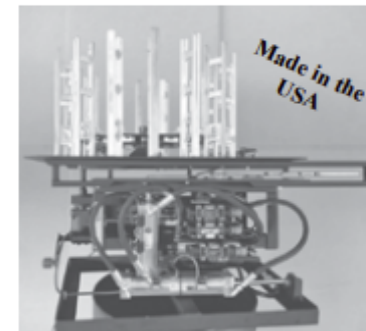

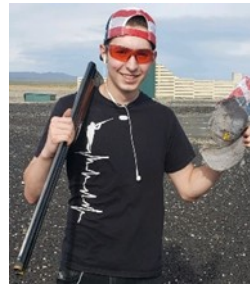
